Eucharistic Ministers are in contact with The Body and Blood of Jesus – His True Presence. .

At the Last Supper, someone had to share the bread and wine around the table.

These were the first Eucharistic Ministers.

Can I Serve

A Eucharistic Minister must be a practicing catholic, in a state of grace, and not conscious of an unconfessed mortal sin.

A Eucharistic Minister must be fully initiated into the sacramental life of the Church. And received the Sacraments of:

- Baptism,
- Confirmation,
- Holy Eucharist and

Not prevented by canon law
(For example such as a marriage not recognized by the church)
