

What does an Altar Server Do?

- Arrive 15 minutes before mass to prepare
- Light the candles in the sanctuary
- Lead the procession as a cross bearer or candle holder
- Set the altar for the consecration
- Receive the gifts of bread and wine
- · Assist Father during the act of consecration
- Ring the bells
- After communion replace the sacred vessels
- Lead everyone out of the church at the end of mass
- On special occasions you will assist Father with holy water and holding the liturgical books

Understanding Serving

When you volunteer as a server at St. Barbara Church. You:

- 1. Light the Candles
- 2. Hold the liturgical books
- 3. Place the sacred vessels
- 4. Arrange the cloths
- 5. Ring the bells
- 6. Carry the cross

Can I Altar Serve

An altar server must be a practicing catholic and have received the sacrament of the Eucharist.

There is a training period with an experienced altar server.

Mass times are at Saturday at 5 PM Sunday at 8 AM or 10 AM

Altar server roles are scheduled a month in advance.

Some holy days and special celebrations may require attendance at different times.
